

Thaya Edwards - Karmic Astrology Lecture/ Workshop

Uranus Roundtable Discussion

The outer planets spend a long time transiting any one sign. Uranus spends about 7 years in a sign, Neptune 14 years, and Pluto - spends an average of 21 years in a sign. As many people share the same sign placement of the outer planets at birth, they can be descriptive of and common to a whole group of people. They are often associated with themes and experiences which are universal. For these reasons, the outer planets are often termed collective, transpersonal and generational.

During the past 7 years, Uranus has transited the dream of Pisces. On March 11th, Uranus enters Aries, birthing a new cycle. If you missed Rose Marcus' Annual Forecast, she called this "a once in a lifetime" transit. Aries is cardinal fire; dynamic, active, and initiating, interested in motion from a stand still. Aries wants to move outward with purpose, towards a goal, or in a particular direction. This is the energy of spring, of new growth. It is

about risk-taking and adventure, boldness and courage. It is the pioneering drive stepping into the unknown and acting without fear.

Uranus is the first outer planet beyond

Saturn, which is associated with structure, boundaries, rules and responsibility. By contrast, Uranus represents the urge to be independent and break free, to be radically different. It is symbolic of rebellion and the overthrowing of old order, much like the protests we've recently seen in Tunisia and Egypt. Revolutionary Uranus is known as "The Great Awakener." It is also considered the higher octave of Mercury, and associated with innovation, creative genius, the brilliant scientific discoveries and enlightenment that brings rapid change.

We're getting together for a round table discussion regarding the significance of Uranus transiting Aries on March 10th. Janice Brown, Denise Grams and Charlotte Greenwood each present an introduction to get the conversation started. Bring your charts, notes, and any important points you'd like to share. This promises to be an engaging evening.



## On Karmic Astrology: Q & A with Thaya Edwards

Thaya Edwards began her astrological education in Russia in the early 1980s, during communist times. The now famous political forecast astrologer Pavel Globa was her 'underground' teacher, and invisibility from the KGB was vital. At first, astrology was her life philosophy, later it developed into her profession. Thaya teaches classes through the Vancouver School Board, writes articles and books, and has produced an instructional DVD on astrology. I asked her to answer a few questions about Karmic Astrology for her upcoming workshop.

### How does Karmic Astrology differ from conventional Western Astrology?

Karmic Astrology looks at the chart from a different point of view: the correlation between fate and free will. It uses the same planets with the same definitions as Western Astrology but different aspects. Those aspects are called karmic and creative, and they help to figure out how high is the level of inevitability (karma) in the chart. In Karmic Astrology we pay a great deal of attention to two additional planets: Black Moon (Lilith) and White Moon (Selena), which represent dark and light karma. The Moon's nodes, fixed stars and retrograde planets also hold big respect in Karmic Astrology.

### How do you define Karma?

Taking it simply, karma refers to the consequences of our deeds. That's why karma can also be good, not just bad. I like this quotation about [The Law of Karma](#):

"For every event that occurs, there will follow another event whose existence was caused by the first, and this second event will be pleasant or unpleasant according to whether its cause was skillful or unskillful".

### Can Karmic Astrology predict the future? Or can one use Karmic Astrology to create a better future for themselves?

Karmic Astrology uses the same predictive techniques as conventional astrology. As for creating a better future, it is all about knowing ourselves. If we understand why certain things in our lives go in certain ways, we can stop making the same mistakes. It looks like in some people's lives things are going in circles: the same situations, similar people. As soon as they understand what it is all about and change their reactions and perception of the situation, repetitions will stop.

Karmic Astrology allows us to look at our lives from a deeper level; it brings insights about a chain of reincarnations. We are able to see our light and dark karma, how strong they are, and our evolutionary tasks. Sometimes it explains why things considered unfair happen in our lives. Karmic Astrology is about awareness and working with inner self.

### Does the degree of inevitability or karma in a chart affect a person's free will? Do some people have less choice or options at hand than others?

It does have an affect. Yes, some people have less freedom in action than others. This is related to past lives as well. If somebody has more choice, it means this person deserved it. People who have a high level of fate didn't use their freedom properly in past lives. That's why now they have limitations.

### Are creative aspects the result of light karma?

No, creative aspects are not the direct result of light karma. They help to determine the level of free will and show areas of life where we have more choices.

### Do we live out the karma of several past lives simultaneously? Do we live out dark and light karma at the same time?

Of course, we do. All of us have done both good and bad in past lives. There are no saints on this Earth: saints don't incarnate in a physical body. We could do more right things in one reincarnation and more wrong things in another, and we did them in different areas of life. That's why Black and White Moons located in different signs are indications of dark and light karma. The most complicated case is when both Lilith and Selena are in the same sign. In this case a current reincarnation will be the time of an important choice.

### Can karmic astrology see specific past lives in the natal chart?

Karmic Astrology can give ideas where we've worked a lot in the past and which areas of life we didn't really touch, what kind of karmic debts we might have and what culture we could be connected to from past lives. It won't give an exact answer to a question like "Was I a sailor or a priest in past life, and what time was it?" For this sort of questions we have past life regression which can be very helpful.

### What about our relationships - Is everyone that we come across or meet in the present connected to us via a past life or karma situation?

No, not everyone. I believe that most of our encounters represent the situation when souls meet for the first time. However, there are a few important karmic connections in everyone's life. I am going to say more about this interesting topic in my talk in the Guild meeting.

### Do we as individuals have a role to play in collective karma? Is there collective karma?

There is the collective karma of countries, religions and mankind as a whole. For example, Canada definitely has different karma than the United States. All of us, whether we like it or not, play our part in the collective karma. In the past I decided I didn't

## The Symbolism Behind Astrology

*"To enter a temple constructed wholly of invariable geometric proportions is to enter an abode of eternal truth."—Robert Lawlor*



The basic premise of astrology is the seasons<sup>i</sup>, which gives us the quadrants of the year. This division is by four and forms a square or quadrature<sup>ii</sup> in terms of geometry and the innate sacred geometry within the wisdom of astrology. Squares equate with our Earthly existence, and provide us with our 'cross' to bear in life.

In the first instalment of this column I discussed the static circle and naturally the sphere, which is the three-dimensional representation of a circle. One of those circles is the Zodiacal belt that replicates the Earth's equator around the imaginary sphere of the heavens. The heavens are pulled down to wrap the Earth in the blanket of the fixed stars<sup>iii</sup> using the same divisions we use to map our world.

### From circles to squares

In an astrological chart we pull down the ecliptic with its twelve zodiacal signs and flatten it into a circle and begin dividing it into areas in order to identify where the influences are prominent for the individual. Lines separate and divide, and are masculine in nature. Once we move beyond the single spark of life, the source of the Big Bang, we arrive at two. The ecliptic in the heavens and the equator on planet Earth divide things into hemispheres, the top one is associated with the Sun and the day, the bottom half with the Moon and the Night Sky. The Southern hemisphere, the one that belongs to the Sun is placed at the top of the chart, which astrology associates with worldly pursuits and accomplishments. This is the arena where we can visible SHINE. The Northern hemisphere, below the horizon of the chart correlates to our private lives and personal accomplishments. The horizon line in our horoscopes is our personal 'equator' and the primary representation of our earthly existence, life here on planet Earth. The Vertical line represents divinity, the heavens and is the second part of our cross.



### Division of space, the dynamism and balance of the square



Our space is now divided into four quadrants, the geometric angles within are at 90 degrees—the dynamic square aspect, which could also be drawn as a square. The square and number four are the symbolic representation of Earth. We have four primary directions, four elements, and four primary issues in life—family, relationships, work and our role in it all. We have four turning points in the day, sunrise and sunset, Noon and midnight. In our year we have two solstices and two equinoxes—the four times a year when the Sun crosses the angles in our astrological wheel.

Altars, monuments, town squares and many manmade structures incorporate a square within a circle and a circle within a square. Circles are a manifestation of divinity and eternity while the square is a manifestation of the physical and is temporal in nature. The first solid form that of a structured square implies immobility, solidification, the four pillars... T-squares are considered a marriage of active and passive—thus equilibrium. In Pythagoras era it was thought that the world rested on four pillars, four columns, and four trees supporting the temple of the manifest world.

The four directions in many religious disciplines represent the four godheads and the four winds of the gods. These were associated with the Eagle, the Bull, the Water bearer and the Lion. In the 1515 woodcarving of the Zodiac by Dürer, four astrologers from the four corners of the Earth are depicted in place of the traditional zodiacal emblems. A solid form represents physical reality and event within a tangible world and within it our free will and our fate. The square also symbolizes righteousness and respect for rules and regulations.


The number four and the square is associated with the planet Mars, whose primary function is to cut; just as lines do—they divide and cut spaces. Interestingly, according to Plutarch, the Pythagoreans stated that the square concentrated the powers of Rhea, the mother of the gods, the source of time, who made herself manifest through changes in the four elements represented by Aphrodite (Water, the source of life), Hestia<sup>iv</sup> (Fire), Demeter (Earth) and Hera (Air). The square represented the synthesis of the elements<sup>v</sup>.

*"Sacred geometry is the unfolding of number in space. The basic journey from the single point, into a line, out to a plane, through to the third dimension and beyond, eventually returning to the point again, all the time watching what happens on the way."—Miranda Lundy*

Squaring the circle—the marriage of Heaven and Earth—was an ancient geometrical problem. There was a practical need to calculate the area of the circle using the tools of the era—a compass and a straight edge. This is impossible with exactitude yet mystical. We can approximate, however the circle is measured by the incommensurable<sup>vi</sup> Pi ( $\pi$ ) and square with rational whole numbers.



*"Amazingly, the Earth and the Moon square the circle"*—Miranda Lundy in her book *Sacred Geometry*. See the illustration of the Earth boxed in by a square and the path of the Moon. This process is widely stated as symbolizing the fusion of matter and spirit, and the marriage of heaven and earth; we are seeking the elusive transcendent and finite qualities. Mathematically the perimeter of the square and the circumference of the square cannot be identical with absolute precision; however, symbolically, we arrive at the awesome geometry within our World and the cycles and spheres of the Cosmos. The varied methods of sacred geometry are considered to bring new understanding on the nature of divinity.



There are various methods of squaring the circle, one of these begins with circles—first we have the infinite dot that both has the potential to expand, or to be the centre of a circle, and once we add a second circle, the circumference of which runs through the centre of the first, we have the womb of the world also known as Vesica Piscis—the oval shape of an almond formed by the overlapping circles—and within it two equilateral triangles are formed by simple division and connecting of the circles. One becomes two, where divinity in potential is divided into duality, which then creates the trinity.


In the next issue I will talk about the triangle, in the meantime observe the circles and squares in our daily life, the trinity in a cross and in the symbol of the premises of the spiritualist church where the Guild holds its meetings—the triquetra.

## In Memoriam

### Robert P. Blaschke

Robert P. Blaschke took his first breath on November 15, 1953 at 1:37 PST on a Saturn day and Mercury hour in Santa Monica, California with 21° Virgo 31' ascending'. On January 18, 2011 at 19:18 PST on Mars' day and with Jupiter's hour, Robert passed away in his sleep. I remember when he talked excitedly about the books he was going to write, when I met him the first time about 20 years ago; seven was the number in his head— he did complete five. In his delineation of his final solar return, he held faint hope that he might complete volume six of his series "Astrology of Life".



There are seven Hermetic Lots in astrology, which define our lot in life. Robert's lot of Spirit was at the exact degree of the most recent Pluto station at 5°25' Capricorn. This lot is closely associated with our mission in life, which I suspect was complete with such exact station--time to pause. The terminal diagnosis he received a year or so ago, caused him to retire to contemplate the spiritual nature of life, to find peace. That degree according to several authors was one of devotion and manifestation with a promise that he will reach his star before his journey ends.

Robert was a frequent and popular presenter at the Fraser Valley Astrological Guild. I remember one year when we were at dinner in a Greek restaurant following his workshop— a long table with some twenty people. I talked the belly dancer into devoting extra attention to Robert, who had just had his birthday. He was truly embarrassed, never one to draw attention to himself. I can see him in his signature pressed jeans and a crisp white dress shirt with the cuffs rolled up, getting ready once again to share of his wisdom. In his five books and in all of his articles, Robert avoided the use of the pronoun I—he was your correspondent, this astrologer, etc. His legacy to contemporary astrology is huge; he wrote primarily for working astrologers and readily shared his insights—a quintessential professional, dedicated to teaching. #### Footnotes:

<sup>i</sup> The dates for the seasons are predictable to the minute and each time two things happen. At the Spring Equinox the Sun crosses the ecliptic and enters Aries. At the Autumnal Equinox the Sun crosses the ecliptic and enters the sign of Libra. At the Summer Solstice the Sun reaches the celestial boundary of the tropic of Cancer, due North, and enters that sign. At the Winter Solstice the Sun reaches the celestial boundary of the tropic of Capricorn and enters that sign. (The places on Earth between 0-23° of latitude lie in the Tropics.)

<sup>ii</sup> An ancient measure of distance between two moving objects; two objects are said to be at quadrature when their ecliptic longitudes differ by 90°.

want to be a part of Russia's karma, and I left the country. Although I don't mind being a part of Canada's karma. We don't have a way of getting out of the Earth to avoid mankind's karma, so we'd better take good care of the planet.

### What was it like studying astrology in Russia? Did it personally deepen your studies at that time? Did you consider leaving the country as part of your own karmic journey?

Nowadays studying astrology in Russia is the same as in the North America only it is much more respected. In communist times (when I began my study) it was like walking on thin ice: you never knew when it might break and you would be in trouble. Trouble meaning punishment for being involved in anti-communist activity.

In some ways I was fortunate because this kind of underground studying gave me deep knowledge and determination. No books were available, so we had to take a lot of notes. You can imagine if you write down a description of all planets, one by one, their location in signs, aspects, houses and so on, you will remember the information. Of course, astrological software wasn't available either (nor in North America in that time). We had to master the calculations. This kind of approach makes an astrologer take a lot of things into consideration and learn how to see the whole picture.

As for my leaving Russia, no, it wasn't a part of my karmic journey. It was the liberation from karma. I left most of my karmic debts behind. I have a lot of free will in my chart originally.

### What fascinates you most about karmic astrology?

That is a difficult question. Karmic Astrology has a lot of fascinating things. The most interesting part for me is that Karmic Astrology is connected to reincarnations and helps to reveal a chain of causes and consequences.
